Rights Respecting Week - 11th - 15th February

We will launch or annual Rights Respecting week on Monday 11th with a whole school assembly outlining our activities during the coming week. Our focus this year is Article 2 that 'The Convention applies to every child without discrimination, whatever their ethnicity, gender, religion, language, abilities or any other status.' During the week, each class will focus on different Rights from the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child. The whole school theme will link to our work on the Educate and Celebrate project looking at diversity and inclusion.

We would like all children to come to school on Monday 11th with their team coloured tops to work in teams during the morning session. On Friday afternoon, we are also planning a celebration event - in a rainbow theme, representing that everyone is unique and that the UN CRC Rights apply to **all** children.
