<u>Cleves Cross Anti-litter Policy</u>

UNCRC Article 29

Education must develop every child's personality, talents and abilities to the full. It must encourage the child's respect for human rights, as well as respect for their parents, their own and other cultures, and the environment.

At Cleves Cross we believe our pupils have the right to learn in a healthy, clean and litterfree environment. We also aim to educate our pupils to value their own community and to know the part they can play in keeping our school a clean place to be whilst caring for the environment.

It is our goal to create a litter free environment for our pupils and staff.

We should recycle waste wherever possible.

We would see these aims being as applied in our local community as well as the area inside the school.

All members of the school are encouraged to suggest ways to improve the school environment.

We do have litter blowing into our school grounds, therefore the collective responsibilities are listed below.

All members of the school community have a responsibility:

- \checkmark not to drop litter
- \checkmark to use recycling bins whenever possible
- \checkmark to put peelings and waste fruit into the compost boxes
- \checkmark to pick up litter which is lying around
- ✓ to tell a member of staff if they see anything that looks unusual or dangerous around our school or grounds
- \checkmark to assist the school caretaker in maintaining a clean site wherever possible

Staff have a collective responsibility:

- \checkmark to support pupils and help them deal with litter problems
- \checkmark to use the recycling bins for all paper
- \checkmark to educate pupils on the consequences of dropping litter

The Eco Committee has a responsibility:

- \checkmark to provide an adequate number of waste and recycling bins
- \checkmark to listen and respond to questions from the members of the community
- \checkmark to ensure that anti-litter education is part of the school curriculum
- \checkmark to provide a litter free environment
