

Cleves Cross Primary School 2020-2021

Our school has been allocated £17,840 from the Government's Sports Premium Funding. The funding continues to be doubled.

This year, we also had an additional £2,930 which was carried over due to underspending last year's premium allocations because of the ongoing coronavirus pandemic. This means the total premium for this academic year is: **£20,770**
